AHC10116 Certificate I in Conservation and Land Management

- ◆ Kick start your career with an **18-week PAID** Greening Work Skills Traineeship and assist in flood recovery work in the Scenic Rim area.
- ◆ Complete your **qualification** and learn new skills outdoors on-the-job.
- ◆ Work hands-on in a supportive team and develop the **skills** and **confidence** you need to secure long-term employment in landscaping, gardening, horticulture and other conservation work.

As a Work Skills Trainee, you will be **employed full-time for 18 weeks, earning up to \$558.40 per week** (National Training Wage Schedule*). You will work in a team at various sites in the **Scenic Rim area**, assisting with flood recovery and conservation and rehabilitation work, while also completing **AHC10116 Certificate I in Conservation and Land Management**. The training and work experience will prepare you for success in the workforce after the traineeship. We will assist you in planning your long-term career and achieve the employment outcome you want.

**The weekly training wage may vary depending on individual trainees' circumstance.*

Trainees will be enrolled in training with Greening Australia. BUSY At Work will administer the training contract.

Trainees will receive all necessary Personal Protective Equipment.

Work experience

Trainees will work as a team and carry out conservation and rehabilitation, horticultural and light construction work around the Scenic Rim area. Under the guidance of a qualified and experienced supervisor, trainees will learn new skills in a real and supportive work environment and complete a variety of work tasks.

The Greening Work Skills Traineeship is ideal for people looking for outdoor-based hands-on work with an interest in a career in the gardening and landscaping, horticulture or greening and conservation industries. Trainees need to meet minimum English language and literacy requirements and be able to perform physical work.

Support program

We will assist trainees through a tailored learner support program to develop their confidence and overall job readiness, and help them look and apply for ongoing employment. Support program topics include:

Eligibility criteria

This Greening Work Skills Traineeship program is funded under the Queensland Government's *Skilling Queenslanders for Work* initiative. To be eligible for a position as a trainee in this program, you must be:

- ♦ a Queensland resident;
- ♦ aged 15 years or older;
- ♦ an Australian citizen, or an Australian permanent resident (including a humanitarian entrant), or a temporary resident with the necessary visa and work permits on a pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen.

This program primarily targets individuals who are:

- ♦ ineligible for Australian Government employment services or assistance (e.g., from Jobactive or Disability Employment Services providers); or
- ♦ require complementary services because they have significant barriers to learning and employment; or
- ♦ have accessed Australian Government services (e.g., through Centrelink and/or Jobactive or DES providers) for more than six months and remain unemployed.
